- In the Association meetings, Dave Schrock discussed this year is an Olympic year and the National office as well as the local associations need to use the extra media coverage to our advantage to get people excited about track and field. There are other sports that are taking kids & adults away from our sport. Pickleball is very popular, and cities are building courts for that. Soccer and football are huge and big money is being spent building facilities for them.

- 3. There was a presentation on "Thinking outside the box for money":
 - a. Look for national, state and private grants
 - b. Request donations for "Giving Tuesday"
 - c. Grocery store designations to USATF
 - d. Advertising at local high schools such as a banner on the field
 - e. Find local ways to advertise for free, such as community or local newspapers/newsletters
 - f. Donations from Lions club
- 4. The national office does have a grant program for officials and youth clubs
- 5. Build relationships with City, county and school boards.
 - a. Use ex athletes of schools to advocate using their fields for practices or meets
 - b. Private schools have a smaller amount of people to approve using tracks, etc, than public schools
- 6. Lots of discussion on how to save money at meets
 - a. For security, try National Guard
 - b. Partner with PAL (Police Athletic League)
 - c. Use USATF insurance leverage facilities, \$15 to add a name
- 7. Ways to spread the word about USATF & meets
 - a. Tell local radio stations about big meets, State & Regionals
- 8. Finding facilities for practices or meets
 - a. Create multi year contracts with facilities to lock in a place to hold meets and hopefully secure a better rate
 - b. Do you have club coaches that coach at a school with a track?
 - c. Do you have coaches with an established relationship at a school?
 - d. Long Island has partnered with schools and do not pay for facilities. They to a meet with "special ed" kids that's all about Inclusion and mental health

- e. Have a para meet in conjunction with our meets
- 9. Lots talk on how to grow membership
 - a. Have board meetings available via zoom and in person
 - b. Create information pamphlets for target groups (elementary, HS, middle high)
 - c. Host all comer meets
 - d. Hold special clinics such a Run Jump Throw, field event
 - e. Hold an informal meet for kids to come out an give T & F a try for fun
 - f. Spread the word that "track" is a foundational sport and will benefit kids in soccer, football, etc

Presidential Task Force
